4. Principal's Report

Angela

- 7 of each English and French classes, 1 specialized program class all classrooms (including 2 portables) full
- Fully staffed ~25FTE teachers, 1.5FTE EA in Specialized program, 1FTE EA for 1:1, and 1.5FTE EA in mainstream; no virtual teachers on-site; Julie is 0.5FTE VP + 0.5FTE Student Success; one Designated Occasional Teacher (DOT) position; 2 staff to help w/ lunch & recess supervision; also fully staffed custodial team
- Staff meeting today:
 - Spec Ed Learning Resource teacher (Kris Storah) has moved on, Kerri Hillier has taken on role – IEP writing in progress, will go home 3rd week of October – parents will receive electronic form to provide input

- Tech not in a position this year to allocate a device for every student; have allocated equipment to those who require per IEP, have asked students who has access to personal tech, next step will be to allocate to classes are aiming for 1:4, hoping to 1:2 ratio device:student
 NOTE: no cell phones allowed out in classroom must stay in backpacks, if need to call home must go to office to use (when changed made, found large decrease in students being sent to office, and increase in student engagement)
- o Website: see website for news/info/athletics & calendar updates there will not be weekly emails with news; tend to use FB/Twitter/Instagram only for "fun stuff" rather than information
- o Meal programs lunch program still on hold; there will be a breakfast program (not traditional, not hot breakfast, but there is a bowl in every class with individually-wrapped items for anyone to access)
- o School learning plans have not yet heard update from board, but do feel they are now positioned to take on new learning projects
- o Budget typically rolls over in January, usually allowed to carry-over any surplus prior year carried forward \$6000, but was clawed back because of COVID measures, for this year, have \$11,000 surplus and as yet unclear if will be allowed to carry-forward; has been 3 years since last large purchase of 10, so that is a priority consideration for this year particularly as ~20% were called back as out-of-date (downside is that must go through tendered vendor which is at higher than typical retail cost); past couple of years have provided resources for phys ed and books for English studies
- Third Path relationship-based approach to teaching; began last year and will restart again this year – first theme is Safety; ahead of curve as Board is rolling out to select schools this year
- o Culturally-response schools assessing resources (novels, texts, visual aids, speakers, etc) to better address cultural responsiveness
- o School visioning current motto: WE can all do better when we work together; work will be done with student council to look at Vision and may amend
- Student Voice place lot of emphasis on student voice; applications will go
 out this week for Student Council reps (2/class); Council decides on
 fundraising, plan dances, plan speakers, etc;
 Denise: to add further information Student Council at GCPS manages much
 of the business that School Councils do in other schools

- Is there a school mascot/team name? (Denise)
 - o At time school changed from K-8, phoenix was chosen to represent rebirth of new school; feedback from staff meeting was to keep the phoenix, but have more discussion about it and strengthen ties to current group of students; there is also a traditional logo; a few years ago, held a student competition for an athletics logo incorporating the phoenix; there is no athletics team name
- JoJo's fundraiser (Denise)
 - o Roxanne will look into
- Clubs will they start/continue? (Ryan)
 - o Currently not allowed to mix cohorts; last year did run some clubs virtually and will do so again this year (ex. Student Council monthly Spirit Days; Cubing Club); are looking at starting Dungeons and Dragons as that can be done virtually

- o Decisions re: which clubs are offered are driven by student requests and so often change year to year
- o Other typical ones would have been Chess Club, Musical and Band
- o Note: high schools are allowed to have sports, GCPS is considered elementary have advocated to be allowed to follow high school given age of students allows most to have been vaccinated awaiting decision
- o Currently, cannot cross-cohort, even outdoors (so not allowed to do outdoor yoga, Eco Club, etc)
- Vaccination status does the school have information as to proportion of students currently vaccinated? (Marielena)
 - Not yet; current focus is gathering attestations of vaccination/exemption from staff, then expect that there will be a dashboard posted on Board website with breakdown of % vaccinated staff and students
