- heavy sense of uncertainty; compassion for kids, parents, teachers; big adjustment; be reassured that will meet students where they are when they return to in school learning; if parents have any concerns re: volume of work/etc, please email Ms. Chaplin or Ms. Corrigan
- Student Success Teacher (Angela Burns) working closely with high school partners; AY Jackson students started meeting with Gr 8 students today; each class has 2 sessions; has also put out message to staff looking for opportunities for students during recess time, particularly if school at home extended, to facilitate some social time between students (ex. teacher hosting yoga session, art project, etc); book club has started (when return in person, students will stay in their classrooms and meet via Google Meet)
- leadership have been dropping in on Google Meets for all classes; have seen some really interesting ideas teachers are implementing for student engagement (ex. breakout groups, jam board questions, etc)
- today's announcement had greater sense of weight than previous, anticipate heightened worry, but from OCDSB perspective messaging at this point is that as far as we know things are proceeding as currently schedules (special programs, certain staff on site; tentative return date Jan 25); at GCPS 5 students coming for BIP plus 3 teachers and 3 EAs

- budget: received allocation as anticipated based on student numbers; have not spent anything at this point; focus was on additional Chromebooks given have purchased equipment in past few years across subjects and anticipated growth in student numbers over next few years

- teaching online is different now than in March students more engaged, more comfortable with using apps, solving problems online, etc; breakout groups work well so that students can work in groups (which is an advantage to school-at-home as they can't do that well when working in person in school given distancing); teachers finding interactive apps students can use together to increase engagement
